**COURSE FORMAT:** Three hours of class time, plus an additional hour delivered through on-line or other activities for a 15-week semester, which includes two weeks for final exams.

**COURSE PREREQUISITE:** 45 credits of 100 level or higher coursework including one of the following research methods courses: ABA 312, CMNS 260, CMNS 262, DSGN 325, EDUC 373, EDUC 473, LAW 210, LBST 200, LBST 201, LBST 330, PSYC 213, MT 462 or TOUR 327.

**COURSE DESCRIPTION:** This course explores contemporary issues from an interdisciplinary perspective. Drawing upon the arts, sciences, and related fields of study, individual offerings of the course will engage in a sustained examination of a range of historical, theoretical and current issues relevant to the selected topic and/or the current Liberal Studies term theme -- e.g. sustainability, memory, and revolution.

**LEARNING OUTCOMES:** Upon successful completion of this course, students will be able to:

- Differentiate between intradisciplinary, crossdisciplinary, multidisciplinary, interdisciplinary, and transdisciplinary research and knowledge production;
- Explore historical and contemporary issues relevant to the topic under investigation;
- Engage with global and national aspects of the topic under investigation;
- Review and analyze current literature in the topic under investigation;
- Demonstrate use of relevant quantitative and/or qualitative reasoning and research methods.
