Capilano University and VanArts sign pathway partnership agreement for students to enhance credentials

NORTH VANCOUVER B.C. June 22, 2021 – Capilano University (CapU) and Vancouver Institute of Media Arts (VanArts) announce a new pathway partnership that allows graduates of VanArts' 12-month Acting for Film & Television diploma program to continue their education at CapU and graduate with additional credentials in Acting for Stage and Screen from CapU.

Acting for Stage and Screen is a three-year diploma program. This agreement allows VanArts graduates to apply up to 42.5 transfer credits and complete the CapU program in two years.
