8. SELF-EVALUATION COMMITTEE

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9. BY-LAW, POLICY AND PROCEDURE COMMITTEE

(a) Prior Learning Assessment Policy

The Prior Learning Assessment Policy was previously brought to Senate for review and discussion, and feedback requested from areas. Some feedback was received and revisions made to the Policy.

A motion to approve was presented; however, there were some concerns with the Policy, specifically items #2 and #3 under the guidelines. Accordingly, it was suggested that Senate approve the Policy with the provision that it be brought back to the Committee for discussion and further revision.

Nanci Lucas moved and Jean Bennett seconded:

14/46 Senate approve the Prior Learning Assessment Policy with the strikeout of #3 and the Policy go back to the By-law, Policy and Procedure Committee to develop an appeal process. It is not required for the Policy to be brought back to Senate.
