Nature & Scope of Work

Instruct theory, lab and clinical courses in the Health Care Assistant program to assist students to acquire caregiving skills within the parameters of the Health Care Assistant role. Through class lectures, hands-on lab experience and clinical practice, develop care-giver skills that maintain and promote the comfort, safety and independence of individuals in facilities and community contexts.

This one time program offering is intended for Indigenous students. Therefore preference will be given to candidates who are Indigenous or have experience working with Indigenous learners.

These duties also include but are not limited to:

- Prepare and deliver all materials required for class lectures, lab and clinical instruction
- Evaluate students’ performance
- Mark all assignments and assign final grades
- Maintain regularly scheduled office hours
- Attend regularly scheduled department and faculty meetings
- Participate on university committees as required
- Work collaboratively with other HCA faculty regarding teaching practices & principles
- Liaise with community complex care facilities, assisted living sites and home support agencies
- Adhere to the duties and responsibilities as stated in the Capilano Faculty Association Collective Agreement

Qualifications & Experience

- Registered Nurse or Registered Psychiatric Nurse currently registered with CRNBC or CRPNBC*
- Bachelor’s degree required to teach theory courses
- LPN with current registration with the CLPNBC may be considered for teaching in the skills lab or clinical area only
- Two or more years of recent full-time (1,400 hours) nursing experience in home support or multi-level/complex care working with adults who have complex health needs
- Demonstrated ability to teach adult learners, which may be evidenced by satisfactory references, positive performance evaluations and student course evaluations OR completion of the Provincial Instructor Diploma Program (or equivalent education)
- Related experience working within Indigenous (First Nations, Métis, or Inuit) students, communities/agencies, including understanding of Truth and Reconciliation and its recommendations
