As a member of the kálax-ay Sunshine Coast Campus team, the Indigenous Initiatives Faculty Advisor will work directly with faculty in indigenizing curriculum, programming, and the learning environment.

Key Responsibilities:

Under the general guidance of the Chair, the Indigenous Initiatives Faculty Advisor is responsible to do the following:

- Support and meet with faculty to assist in the process of Indigenizing their curriculums and programs
- Liaise and collaborate with relevant people and departments within the University to establish culturally appropriate practices, policies and systems
- Support and contribute to the work of the Aboriginal Student Success Plan
- Liaise with the Kéxwusm-áyakn (First Nations) Student Centre at the North Vancouver campus to align with Indigenization initiatives
- Work with the Community Liaison to fulfill the intent of any existing affiliation agreements and align with the TRC's Calls to Action and UNDRIP where relevant.
- Support implementation of institutional indigenization and decolonization initiatives
- Participate in meetings, conferences, workshops, seminars, and presentations pertaining to Indigenous education
- Work closely with the Indigenous Initiatives and Special Project Developer to work on the implementation of ongoing initiatives

- Consult with Elders and other key shishalh Nation members to ensure cultural safety and guide the transmission
 of knowledge at the kalax-ay regional campus.
- Attend campus meetings regularly, and report on activities
- Deliver cultural protocols and practices for campus and course activities in collaboration with campus faculty and staff.
- Perform other duties as required

- A Master's degree from an accredited institution, with a focus in education, psychology, social work or Indigenous studies, or an equivalent combination of education, training and experience
