

Capilano University Tri-Agency Research Support Fund (RSF) Information

The Research Support Fund (RSF) program is a federal government funding initiative administered through the three research granting agencies: The Social Sciences and Humanities Research Council (SSHRC), the Natural Sciences and Engineering Research Council (NSERC) and the Canadian Institutes of Health Research (CIHR). The RSF helps Canadian universities cover a portion of the expenses incurred as a result of conducting research, known as the *indirect* or *overhead* costs of research. Indirect costs of research expenses incurred by the university include a broad range of costs, such as maintaining research facilities, information systems, software resources and research development and support services. The RSF is essential to CapU's success in maintaining a supportive research environment for faculty, students and the broader community.

Research Support Fund: Value and Expenditure Areas

The value of Research Support Fund allocation for each university varies from year to year and is based on a percentage of the total federal research funding received from the Tri-Agencies over a three-year period. Institutions typically distribute their RSF allocations in a variety of ways within five expenditure areas:

- 1. research facilities
- 2. research resources
- 3. management and administration of the institution's research enterprise
- 4. regulatory requirements and accreditation
- 5. intellectual property and knowledge mobilization
