Paul Dangerfield has more than 20 years executive experience as an officer in the Canadian Forces reaching the rank of Lieutenant Colonel, filling posts as Commanding Officer, Chief of Staff and Chief Instructor while serving throughout Canada and in the US, England, Germany, Bosnia-Herzegovina and Rwanda. Upon retirement he became the senior partner and co-owner of Sustainable Leadership Solutions, a consulting company that helps businesses to develop leadership and organizational effectiveness.
