6. New Business

6.1 Student Housing Naming

Presented by: Kari Wharton

As background, in Spring 2024, guided by the University's Director, Indigenous Education & Affairs, and the Indigenous Education Steering Committee (IESC), it was determined that each of the host Nations—the Skwxwú7mesh Úxwumixw (Squamish Nation) and the səlilwəta+ (Tsleil-Waututh Nation)—would contribute a name for the North Vancouver campus' first on-campus student housing building.

Although the *University Act* is silent on Senate's role in the naming of buildings, Policy B 301 identifies a role for Senate for naming done in perpetuity. Given that in the proposed names are in perpetuity, and that the Senate Naming Committee is not a fully populated committee, in consultation with the previous Senate Vice Chair and Chair of the Policy and Governance Committee, it was determined that the proposal be brought to Senate for approval. The proposal also will go to the Board of Governor's for their consideration of approval at their next meeting.

Diana Twiss moved and Priya McMurtrie seconded:

- The committee reviewed Senate policy S2002-04 Definition of a Full-Time Student and the recommendation was to rescind this policy. The policy defines a full-time student but is not bound by rules governing scholarships, bursaries, awards, student aids, etc. and it was suggested that the definition of a full-time student be listed in the university calendar.
- Committee members recommended that it may be beneficial to merge the Naming Opportunities Committee with the Tributes Committee. The Tributes Committee is mainly involved with naming honorary degree recipients and academic emeritus and the Naming Opportunities' mandate also is about naming of university assets thus a logical merger of two committees.

Committee members indicated some concern regarding Board policy B.301 particularly with the wording with Senate consultation, and naming proposals that are not related to a donation or the naming of an individual, group or organization.

• For this term, the committee will be shifting its meeting time from the 2nd and 4th Tuesday of the month to the 2nd and 4th Monday of each month.

BACKGROUND

The following was submitted by the proponent:

This policy was identified as a candidate for rescission during a review of the Registrar's Office policies. The proposal is to rescind the policy with the definition of a full-time student information remaining included within the academic calendar for reference.

Context

This policy simply provides a definition as to what the university considers (for academic purposes) a full-time student. Policy scope specifically excludes scholarships, bursaries, awards, government student aid, students registered with Accessibility Services, or any external agencies.

This application of this policy is limited as the policy explicitly states that the definition does not relate to student loan eligibility, students with accessibility needs approved by Accessibility Services, or external agencies (i..e sponsorships).

Issues identified

No issues have been raised in relation to this policy beyond whether it is necessary to have a standalone policy with such narrow scope.

Risk, Benefits and Strategy alignment

No significant risks, benefits or strategic alignment have been identified for this policy. Rescission will simply reduce the volume of policies maintained by the university.

Consultation

Consultation has taken place within the Registrar's Office and with the Senate Policy and Governance Committee. An environmental scan was conducted, and the result of this scan is that the definition of a full-time student is either included within another policy (not a stand-alone policy) and/or included is the university's academic calendar.

PURPOSE

To propose that the Terms of Reference of the Senate Naming Opportunities Committee be combined with those of the Senate Tributes Committee with a new name reflective of the responsibilities of the committee thereby reducing the number of Senate subcommittees by one.

MOTION

THAT in accordance with Senate Bylaws Article 8.1, the Tributes Committee and Naming Opportunities Committee integrate their terms of reference such that the necessary responsibilities of Senate regarding naming of buildings, spaces, and programs (as per Policy B.301) are included in a new terms of reference document, including consultation with current members and past members (if available) of the Naming Opportunities Committee.

THAT that Senate assume the responsibilities of the Naming Opportunities Committee until such time as the new Terms of Reference have been completed and a new committee name for the combined Terms of Reference be identified.

BACKGROUND

The Background section was submitted by Dr. Laureen Styles, Chair of Senate:

As per Senate Bylaws (Article 8.1), the Senate Policy and Governance Committee has the ability to make recommendation to Senate on the establishment and dissolving of standing and ad-hoc committees. While the Naming Committee has been in existence for some time, in reality, this committee rarely meets (perhaps once in six years or so). This year the committee membership has not yet been fully populated.

There are discrete responsibilities of Senate with buildings that are outlined in the university policy, <u>B 301: Naming of Buildings, Spaces, and Programs</u>, and its related <u>procedure</u>, consistent with the *University Act*. Given the infrequent requests to the Naming Opportunities Committee and the limited scope of responsibility, there is an opportunity to include the

necessary responsibilities with the Tributes Committee with the review of the Terms of Reference for the two committees this year.

Context

In the 2024-25 academic year, Senate approved a new committee, the Graduate Studies Committee, thus increasing the number of Senate subcommittees by one. Combining the functions of the Naming Opportunities Committee with the Tributes Committee will bring the number of Senate committees back to its original number and thus reduce the number of committee members needed overall to populate the Senate subcommittees.

Issues identified

In considering the proposal to combine the functions of the Naming Opportunities Committee with the Tributes Committee, SPGC reviewed Board Policy B.301 and the accompanying Procedure B.301.1. SPGC made a number of recommendations to the Policy Office (and thus to the Board). These included a recommendation to broaden the scope of B.301 and B.301.1 such that names other than those associated with philanthropy be included. A second recommendation was to make the policy and procedures clearer about when Senate is to be consulted regarding naming proposals (i.e. which types of names/naming opportunities require Senate approval). Third, a suggestion was made that a nomination process be outlined when a unit is to be named. Fourth, the committee suggested that the policy/procedure be clearer about how/when Indigenous people are consulted for naming opportunities. Finally, the committee recommended that the policy/procedures be clearer about the broader spectrum of names which could be proposed (i.e. names other than those of donors or important people).



Risk, Benefits and Strategy alignment

No significant risks have been identified with this proposal. A benefit would be fewer Senate committees and fewer committee members needed.
