Jackie presented to Senate the policies for some of the major Senate committees. Most of the policies were fairly similar and in revising them, a parallel process for the election of the Chair and term of office for each committee was created. The revisions to the existing policies consisted mainly of name change and amending the membership structure for a composition of at least 50% faculty members. The policy on the Senate Committee on University Honours includes the former policy of Faculty Emeritus, and as this policy had not previously been approved, Senate was requested to approve this policy. Also, the Senate Nominating Committee – Vice-Chair is a new policy which incorporates the previous policy on nominating the Chair.

7. UNIVERSITY TRANSITION

- (a) Selection of Non-Voting Representatives

The Faculty of Fine and Applied Arts and the Faculty of Arts and Sciences were previously requested to decide on a selection process for the non-voting member on Senate from their faculties. This member will have speaking rights, and will be granted voting privileges if one of the other two faculty members from his/her Faculty were absent from the Senate meeting. Both Faculties decided to implement identical processes.

Nadine Bruce moved and Towser Jones seconded:

That in the Faculty of Fine and Applied Arts and the Faculty of Arts and Sciences, the non-voting alternate representative will be the candidate who places third in the Faculty Member Senate Elections.

The motion was opened for discussion. A friendly amendment was suggested by Rae Nickolichuk to delete the word "alternate" from the motion.

The motion now reads:

Once all nominations are received, the names will be posted on the University website and instructions on on-line voting will be distributed. There was a discussion regarding issues that may arise with respect to electronic voting and how these issues will be addressed. Results of the election will be announced and posted on February 25th.
