Laureen Styles, VP Academic and Provost, provided an update on academic continuity, including the following highlights:

- Spring planning will see a slight increase in in-person and mixed mode classes and Lonsdale will create some additional space capacity.
- Final exams have a small number of in-person exams occurring (less than 20%) based on a set of criteria for requirements and careful review, and OHS measures are in place.
- Request from the Ministry of Advanced Education, Skills and Training for all
 public post-secondary institutions to submit a report on current and future
 plans and this report has been submitted with input from senior leadership,
 highlighting both successes and challenges.
- Significant numbers of faculty have participated in activities offered through the Centre for Teaching Excellence (more than 70%), reflecting the commitment of faculty to adapt and transition teaching and approaches, working to include best practices.
- Provincial academic continuity group with vice president academics/ provosts and Ministry continues to meet to share current status and collaborate on future approaches in the post-secondary sector with the Ministry convening these meetings.

launched on the Tsleil-Waututh Squamish Land on the water where these ceremonies had been taking place for thousands of years.

- The University was recently informed by Universities Canada that the membership held their vote to determine whether the Capilano University would be a member of Universities Canada, and it was a unanimous decision by the membership, showing their confidence in the University being a member of Universities Canada. This involved a lot of work and Senate was acknowledged for their leadership and guidance in this process.
- Further to the VP Academic and Provost's report, the two reports submitted
 to government, the Steady Increase Plan and the Student Learning Plan will be
 shared with the incoming Minister of Advanced Education, Skills and Training.
 Although not yet formulated, the University's ask of government when the
 Minister is in place will be around supporting institutions in their
 transformation and the work the University needs to do in order to continue
 to support the students.
- In her role as President of the CFA, Anthea Mallinson, brought forward a
 request that Senate consider ways to provide more opportunities for
 observers to participate in Senate meetings. In this regard, work will be
 undertaken to explore other options to use as a platform for the Senate
 meetings.

8.3 VP Academic and Provost

Laureen Styles provided the VP Academic and Provost report, and some of the key highlights were as follows:

Subject: Schedule of dates - Spring 2021 term

Date: November 23, 2020

With the schedule of dates for the university being under the responsibility of the Registrar, consideration for revisions to the established schedule are being brought forward to Senate for information, and in this particular situation in the exceptional context of the pandemic, advice.

Revision to the University Schedule of Dates:

- Spring term to be delayed by one week, and commence on January 11, 2021
- All related deadlines to shift to one week later (e.g., withdrawal date, last day of classes, final examperiod)

Background:

A myriad of factors come to bear when considering a delayed start to the Spring term: the ongoing nature of the pandemic; the recent enhanced regulations and recommendations from the Provinical Health Officer, Dr. Bonnie Henry as the province deals with an upswing in cases; equity consideration with any possibility of changes to school closures particularly influencing families, guardians, caregivers with school aged-children; the challenges of time for many faculty to adapt and further develop online teaching based on best and leading practices; how the seasonal closure falls in the calendar means no lead up from the university closure to the start of the new term (e.g., closing on the 24^{th} and opening January 4^{th}), and provincial and national indicators of ongoing stress with the pandemic affecting mental well being. Shifting the start of the term will afford the same range of instructional days while also creating (a) additional time for students to focus on renewal and mental wellbeing, and (b) additional time for faculty and staff to prepare for the start of a new term.

Recognizing that this consideration is occurring late in the current semester without significant opportunity to sort through what may be a range of additional academic operational consideration and/or implications, a dvice from Senate is being sought in order to make a final determination.
