University One for Aboriginal Learners Certificate Program Profile

The University One for Aboriginal Learners program profile is being revised to remove USSD 105 and add USS 100, an existing course. This revision was a result of USS 100 being redeveloped and identified as a better fit for Indigenous learners.

#### 5. MINOR

Minor in Cinema Studies

*Presented by: Deborah Wainwright and Michael Thoma*

The School of Motion Pictures Arts (MPA) is proposing a new Minor in Cinema Studies (18 credits) that is built on courses from the School of MPA combined with a selection of existing courses from across the University. Students will be supplied with the skills to recognize the forces (cultural, industrial, social, and political) that shape the broadcast and reception of motion pictures, while increasing their media literacy and critical thinking skills – skills considered essential for improved employment opportunities and success.

During the presentation, the School of MPA also proposed revisions to the Minor, which included introducing the Minor in January 2022 instead of Fall 2021 and removing BPAC 400 from the list of elective courses in the Minor program profile.

Before the Minor is forwarded for Ministry review, a note/disclaimer indicating that not all elective courses may be offered each term will be added and the NOC code for Paralegal will be reviewed/adjusted (Appendix 5 information).

#### 6. BIOLOGY

BIOL 109 – Introductory Biology

*Presented by: Eugene Chu*

BIOL 109 – Introductory Biology is a new course that will replace the current BIOL 106/107 package of courses. This will provide a pathway to students who do not



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have the chemistry prerequisites and will be helpful administratively, as there is currently a lot of confusion regarding BIOL 106/107, which are listed as two separate courses, although they function as a single course. BIOL 109 will replace BIOL 106/107.

As BIOL 109 is a copy of BIOL 106/107, the course will include the same designations as BIOL 106/107, i.e., Science designation, Laboratory Science designation, and Cap Core designation under the heading *Science and Technology*.
