5. SCHOOL OF BUSINESS

BADM 385 – Business and Sustainability BADM 395 – Business and Society Presented by: Lydia Watson

In 2021, the School of Business struck a task force with the goal of re-imagining and re-designing the BBA. This was the result of the 2020 Accreditation Council for Business Schools and Programs (ACBSP) report, which identified issues with student retention, DWF rates and program learning outcome scaffolding. The BBA Task force developed planning principles for a revised BBA based on local competitor analyses, literature reviews focused on future skills, employer needs, and business competencies. New BBA PLOs were developed and approved in 2022 by the department. A curriculum mapping project with the new PLOs identified gaps in current required courses and prioritized courses to be revised and new courses to be developed.

A revision to BADM 385 was made on the floor to remove any references to "WIL course" and replace same with "experiential."

On discussion, a concern was raised that the prerequisites for BADM 395 include "three credits of Cap Core *Self and Society*," but the specific courses that would fulfil this requirement are not listed. It was suggested that for clarity around prerequisites for the students, consideration be given to listing the specific courses as opposed to listing the courses as "three credits of Cap Core *Self and Society*." It was decided that the presenter will work with the Registrar's Office to determine the procedural aspects for ensuring that the students understand which courses would fulfill this prerequisite requirement.
