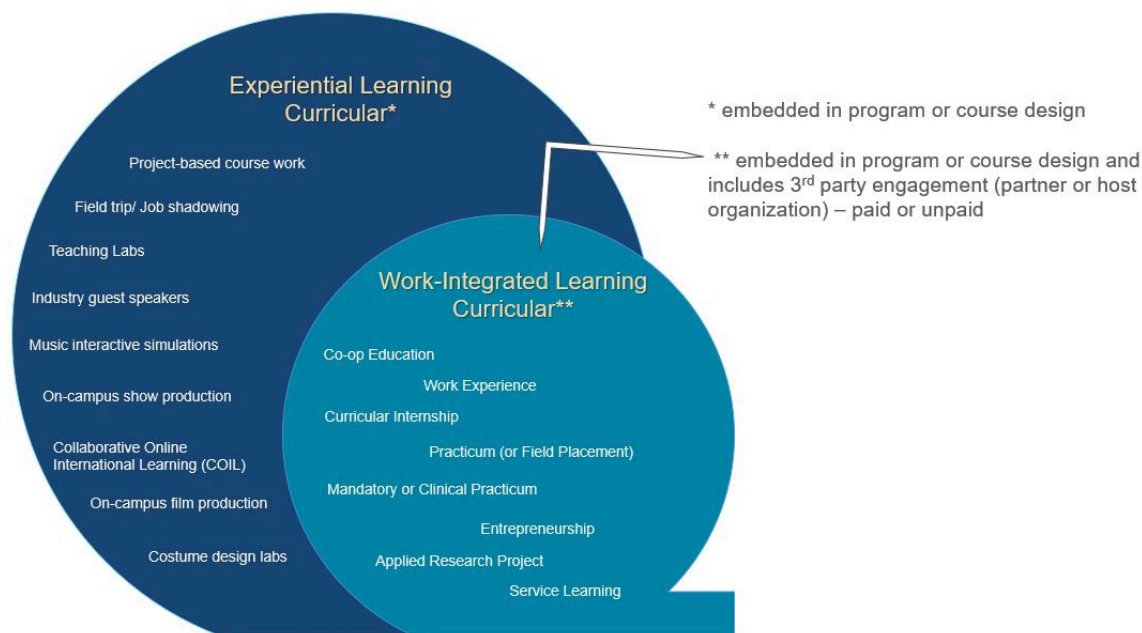

WILCAP—Work-integrated learning at your doorstep

Capilano University is excited to announce **WILCAP**, a new internal work-integrated learning program connecting students with curricular learning experiences found across CapU's non-academic units.

WILCAP helps departments move projects forward while offering students meaningful, real-world experiences through a practicum, co-op, work experience or applied research project. Opportunities may be paid or unpaid and vary in length depending on the program.

With the launch of this new program, all departments engaging students in curricular WIL must register through WILCAP, even if a student has been already identified.

A glance at Fall 2025 WIL-related stories

Fall 2025 was an incredible term full of wonderful WIL opportunities across all five faculties. The WIL team supported connections for long-form types of WIL in the business and communications as well as IDEA School of Design and and psychology programs.

We facilitated 19 projects involving over 560 students.
