COURSE OBJECTIVES:

General:

This course is the second of a pair of mixed mode courses. Students will continue to examine various issues within the arts and entertainment industry. Throughout the term, students will share and reflect on their experience through online forums, journals and final seminars.

- assess personal experiences and progress in the field;
- set, monitor and adjust both short-term and long-term career goals;
- employ principles of effective communication at a professional level;
- model professional behaviour standards;
- apply personal strategies for success in the industry; and
- discuss arts and entertainment in the context of wider society and its economic and political trends.
