Language Requirement: **Other than English**

All BA students will demonstrate competency in a language other than English equivalent to BC high school Grade 11. Students meet competency by one of the following:

- Successful completion of any Grade 11 course with a minimum B grade in an approved language other than English while in secondary school; or
- Successful completion of any secondary immersion program or secondary school at an institution at which the primary language of instruction is not English; or
- Successful completion of a post-secondary credential awarded by an institution at which the primary language of instruction is not English; or
- Successful completion of 3.00 credits of a post-secondary level course in a language other than English.

Students who fulfill this requirement with the above options will be required to take 3.00 credits of lower level Arts and Sciences courses in place of the Language Requirement credits.

Note: Students must ensure they complete a minimum of 65 credits of 100-level or higher coursework from within the Faculty of Arts & Sciences that have been designated as Arts, Humanities or Social Sciences.

Note: Students may obtain a Concentration in Applied Psychology by completing PSYC 410 and PSYC 430 and 6.00 credits from the Applied Psychology group as their Upper-Level Electives requirement.

- **Quantitative/Analytical Requirement:** A Quantitative/Analytical course is a requirement of all University baccalaureate degrees.

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- **Residency Requirement:** Students transferring to Capilano University must complete a minimum of 50% of their program course credits at Capilano University, the majority of which will normally fulfill the requirements of their final years of study.
- **Graduation Requirement:** A *minimum CGPA of 2.00* (calculated on all program required courses) must be achieved to graduate from all Capilano University credentials. Programs may have additional graduation requirements as approved by the University Senate.
 - Check your cumulative Grade Point Average (cGPA) yourself using the [GPA Calculator](#) on CapU website.
- **Timeframe for Completion of the program and Graduation:** Students in a four-year program would be given ten years to complete their program.

- **Cap Core Requirement:** Students starting in their baccalaureate degree on or after Fall 2018 and graduating on or after June 2022 must meet Cap Core graduation requirements in addition to their program requirements.
