

Lost In Wonderland Playwright's Notes

When I sat down to write this adaptation, I had never read the Lewis Carroll originals, even though *Alice's Adventures in Wonderland* and *Through the Looking-Glass and What Alice Found There* have long been cultural touchstones.

Upon reading the books, what struck me the most was Alice's search for meaning. Words like "nonsense," "meaning" and "confusion" are repeated again and again. Alice is bewildered by the strange world around her and constantly tries to find order in the chaos. She rarely does. "It seems very pretty," she says about the poem Jabberwocky, "but it's rather hard to understand."

I have also been preoccupied over the last few years, as I imagine many of us have, with confusion brought on by profound uncertainty. What is the next crisis going to be? Pandemics, climate change and war loom over all of us. When considering how to begin this adaptation, I thought about how all of this has affected young people. How does anyone—but young people especially—navigate this upheaval? I saw the uncertainty of our world reflected in Wonderland, and I wanted the audience to see that, too. I knew Alice had to be a modern-day Alice, a person from our world and with concerns of our time.

Another thing that struck me about the books is that they are twins to one another. Each has twelve chapters, each follows the same story pattern, and within each are actual twins. The Tweedles are twins, and Alice herself becomes a twin, the White Queen to the Red Queen, in *Looking-Glass*. There was something in all those mirror images that I wanted to explore.

Alice Liddell, the inspiration for Carroll's story, was a real person. And she had an older sister named Lorina. When I learned that, I decided that Alice herself had to be twinned. After all, Hansel and Gretel make it through the woods because they have each other. What if Alice and her sister Lorina both journey into Wonderland? Together, they would each have a better chance of finding their way through than if they were alone.

I'm not sure exactly where they come to by the end. But even if they don't know—and even if we don't understand everything—at the very least, I hope we find delight in imagination, and comfort, companionship, joy and love with those who are dear to us. Not much else makes sense.

LEWIS CARROLL – Biography


Lewis Carroll (1832-1898) is the pen name of Charles Dodgson. He was born in a small village in Cheshire, England, but spent most of his life at Oxford University, where he was a lecturer in mathematics. He was also a pioneering photographer of the Victorian era, specializing in celebrities and children. *Alice's Adventures in Wonderland* was published in 1865 with original drawings by artist John Tenniel, which helped establish the iconography of the book. In 1871, he published *Through the Looking-Glass and What Alice Found There*. Because of these two books, he became the most celebrated children's author of his day. He published several other books in his life, including books of puzzles and games, but remains best known as the author of the Wonderland stories.

PRODUCTION TEAM BIOS

Bill Dow - Director

Bill Dow is an award winning actor and director, and occasional professor and writer. Dow has directed several award-winning productions for theatres across Canada including at the Vancouver Playhouse where he was Artistic Associate for many years. In addition, he has performed many lead roles on stage, and served as Associate Artistic Director at the Blyth Festival and the Belfry Theatre, and resident dramaturg at the Banff Playwrights Colony.

Well-known as Dr. Lee on the *Stargate* franchise and Mayor Russ Hathaway on *DaVinci's Inquest*, Dow has also performed recurring roles on television programs such as *The X-Files*, *Kyle XY*, *Nothin' Too Good for a Cowboy* among others. Film credits include directing the



award-winning short film, *The Alley*, and supporting roles in *Legends of the Fall*, *Mr. Magoo*, *This Boy's Life*, *The Big Year*, and many others.

He has written a number of plays including the acclaimed *Bachelor Brothers On Tour with Martin Kinch*, based on the characters of Bill Richardson.

Bill Dow earned his interdisciplinary PhD in classical mythology and theatre at Simon Fraser University, and currently teaches acting and directing at Capilano University in North Vancouver.



Michelle Deines - Playwright

Michelle Deines is an award-winning writer who works in multiple genres, including poetry, non-fiction and drama. Her work has been published in several magazines, including Contemporary Verse 2 and Understorey Magazine. Most recently, her piece "Notre Dame d'Espace" was included in Letters from Montreal (Vehicule Press), an anthology that is a collection of the column of the same name from Montreal's Maisonneuve Magazine. Her plays include The Nighthawks, recently produced by Yellow Point Drama in Nanaimo, an adaptation of Sense & Sensibility (seen here at CapU in

2018), and A Dog at a Feast. She's thrilled to see *Lost in Wonderland* on stage at CapU, brought to life by such a talented group of students, director, designers and crew. She teaches theatre history and playwriting here at Cap, where she's been a faculty member since 2017. Special thanks to Bill Dow for his help on the script.



Brian Ball - Set Designer

Brian Ball is a BC based Artist and Designer. After completing his BFA in Visual Arts from Memorial University (Newfoundland) he moved BC to complete his MFA in Theatre set and Costume design at UVIC (Victoria). 
Solana Lavineway
