


Evan Parker Look (Maksim Blowhardovitch)



DIRECTORS NOTES:

A few years ago, Keri and I were in New York and happened upon the play Dracula: A Feminist Revenge Fantasy, Really and immediately recognized its potential. We were excited about the range of roles for the students but also by how it reclaims a story long rooted in fear, control, and male dominance—and transforms it into something powerfully self-aware, playful, and unapologetically feminist. This adaptation invites us to look again at the monsters we've inherited from literature and popular culture, and to ask who gets to tell the story—and who has been left out of it.

In our process, the creative team and cast approached this play as both an act of rebellion and an act of collaboration. Together, we explored questions of gender, desire, and agency through movement, sound, and text. We leaned into the absurdity, the sensuality, and the chaos of it all, discovering a world that is both gothic and gleefully subversive.

One of the most rewarding aspects of producing work within a university setting is the spirit of shared creation. Dracula has been shaped by the collective imagination of students and faculty alike—designers, performers, and mentors all contributing their artistry and insight. This piece stands as a reflection of that process: a community of learners and makers pushing against boundaries, reimagining the classics, and finding power in collaboration.

So tonight, as we step into this strange, seductive world, I invite you to join us in rethinking the myth. What if the monster was never the problem? What if the fantasy was freedom all along? Cathy Wilmot and Keri Minty Directors

James McBurnie (Jonathan)


